Turtles, Toads & Snakes, Oh My!*Monday, June 26 (Critter Camp day 1)*

Discover the homes of reptiles and amphibians, find out more about them, and craft your own critter.

Feathered Friends*Tuesday, June 27 (Critter Camp day 2)*

Focus on birds — how to recognize them by sight and sound, enjoy them, and protect them.

Insect Safari*Wednesday, June 28 (Critter Camp day 3)*

Night Flight*Monday, July 3*

Study nocturnal winged creatures, from owls to bats to fireflies. Pick apart an owl pellet to reveal prey.

Artists in Nature*Wednesday, July 5*

Using the world of nature as inspiration, pass the hours exploring and creating unique crafts.

Wilderness Survivor*Friday, July 7*

Get the basics of wilderness safety. Learn to pack for survival, orient yourself, and recognize helpful plants.

Wildlife Detectives*Monday, July 24*

Use sharp eyes and open ears to search for wildlife. Craft an animal track and go on a "scatvenger" hunt.

Creepy Crawlies*Wednesday, July 26*

Some animals are misunderstood and unloved, but are actually really cool. Rethink spiders, snakes, and skunks.

In a Scientist's Shoes*Friday, July 28*

Hone observation skills on live plants and animals. Do some crazy experiments in the laboratory.

Stream Scientists*Monday, August 14 (Wild About Water day 1)*

Wade in, turn stones, and discover what stream dwellers can tell us about the health of estuaries.

Mucking in the Mudflats*Tuesday, August 15 (Wild About Water day 2)*

Squish into goopy mud and explore salt marsh pools that are home to minnows, eels, snails, and clams.

Tidepool Tales*Wednesday, August 16 (Wild About Water day 3)*

Wade the rocky shallows left on Laudholm Beach at low tide, searching for salty surprises.

Fantastic Fish*Thursday, August 17 (Wild About Water day 4)*

The salt marsh is a challenging place for animals to live. Find out how fish manage salt, heat, and cold.
